The climate in Japan is characterized by four distinct seasons: spring, summer, autumn and winter. April in Tokyo is spring with temperatures ranging between 10°C and 20°C or between 50°F and 68°F. This generally means comfortable and crisp, sometimes bit chilly.

Time Zone

The time in Japan is 9 hours ahead of the Greenwich Mean Time (GMT +9).

Electricity

The power supply in Tokyo is 100-Volt 50Hz system. It is recommended that you bring an international travel adaptor/power converter with you.

Consumption tax - VAT

Consumption tax is levied on almost all goods and services at a single rate of 8% and is included in the retail price in most cases. Please be careful because only a price excluding tax is sometimes indicated.

Tipping

There is no tipping custom in Japan. Please note that certain upscale restaurants and hotels may add 10% to your bill as a service charge.

Dress code

The dress code for the conference and dinners except for the Gala Dinner is business casual - collared shirts but no t-shirts or jeans. The Gala Dinner on Friday 6th April is formal, this would include business suit / national dress / cocktail dress / formal gala dress.

Sightseeing Spots in Tokyo



◀ **Tokyo Metropolitan Government Office**, built in 1991, is one of Tokyo's landmarks with an observatory on the 45th floor. (Nearest station: Tocho-mae, very close to our venue)



◀ **Shinjuku Gyoen National Garden** was originally created as a garden for the Imperial Family in 1906 and is currently a national garden, harmonising both European and Japanese styles. (Nearest station: Shinjuku-Gyoen-mae)

▶ **Tokyo Tower**, built in 1958, the broadcasting tower, is 333 meters (1,093ft) high. You can enjoy a view of the entire city of Tokyo from the 150meters (492ft) and 250meters (820ft) high observatory. (Nearest station: Kamiya-cho)



▶ **The State Guest Houses** are the government facilities established to accommodate heads of the states, prime ministers and other honoured guests from abroad. (Nearest station: Yotsuya)



◀ **Tokyo Skytree** built in 2012, is a broadcasting, restaurant and observation tower. It is the tallest structure in Japan, 634 meters (2,080ft) high. (Nearest station: Tokyo Skytree)



◀ **Tokyo Station**, the Renaissance-style redbrick architecture built in 1914 and fully renovated in 2012, is the central station of Tokyo Metropolitan. The building of Tokyo Station was registered as an "Important Cultural Properties in Japan" in 2003.

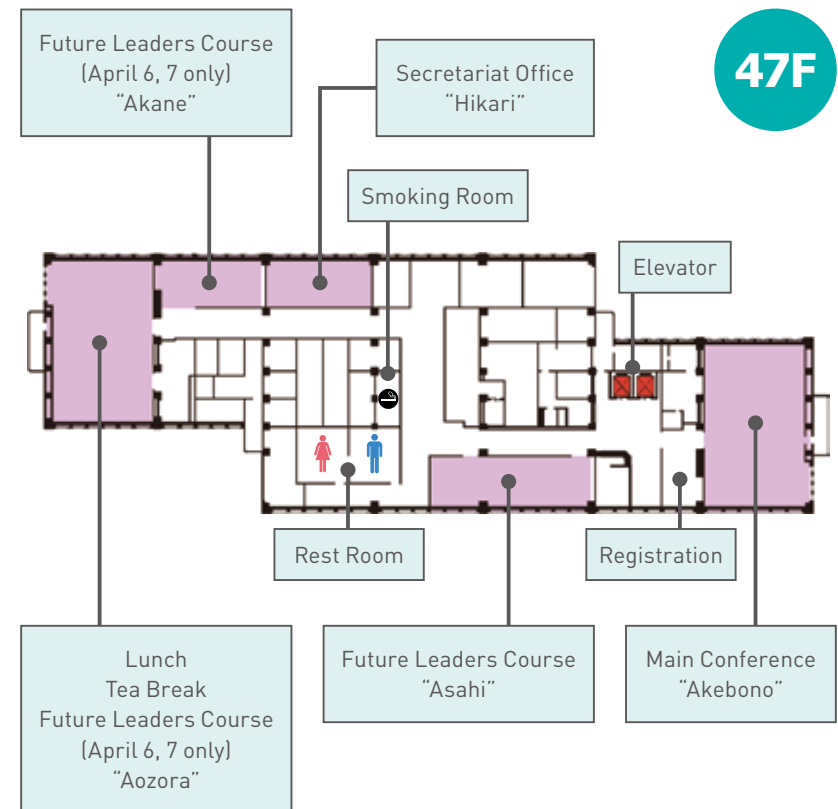
